Colossians 1:1-14



BEFORE THE PRESENTATION

Read: Colossians 1:1-14; Ephesians 1:15-20; 3:14-19; Philippians 1:3-11

Discussion: Paul is thankful for the Colossians' spiritual growth and **PRAYS** for them regarding: *their love for the believers, bearing fruit, understanding the grace of God, knowledge of God's will, walking in a manner worthy of the Lord, increasing in the knowledge of God, endurance, patience, joy, thankfulness.*

Choose **two items** from this list—a **strength** and a **weakness** (e.g., *strength* - you have endured a lot of hardships and have overcome; you are always joyful; *weakness* - you see little 'fruit' in your life and/or ministry; you are impatient with immature believers).

1. Share with the group why you chose these two items.
2. In which way is your strength impacting those who serve the Lord with you?
3. In what practical ways can you grow in your area of weakness?
4. Have the group pray for you for these two areas.

COLOSSIANS 1:1-14

IN PRISON, Paul focused on what is important:

- **Introducing prisoners & guards to Yeshua**
- **Constant & generous prayer**
- **Encouraging the body of believers**
- **Salvation of the lost**
- **Reassuring & supporting leaders, etc.**



Monday Devotional Colossians 1:1-14



AFTER THE PRESENTATION

Read: Genesis 39; Acts 16:16-28; 2 Corinthians 11:16-33

Discussion: Paul was both a prisoner of the empire and a prisoner of the Lord. Picture yourself as a ‘prisoner’ incarcerated in a federal correctional institution.

1. What is your attitude?
2. What are your fears and struggles?
3. Who do you associate with?
4. What lessons do you learn and how can you apply them to your life during and after incarceration?
5. What similarities are there between being ‘a prisoner of the empire’ and a ‘prisoner of the Lord’? What does it mean to you to be a ‘prisoner of the Lord’?

Trinitarian Prayer from John Stott
